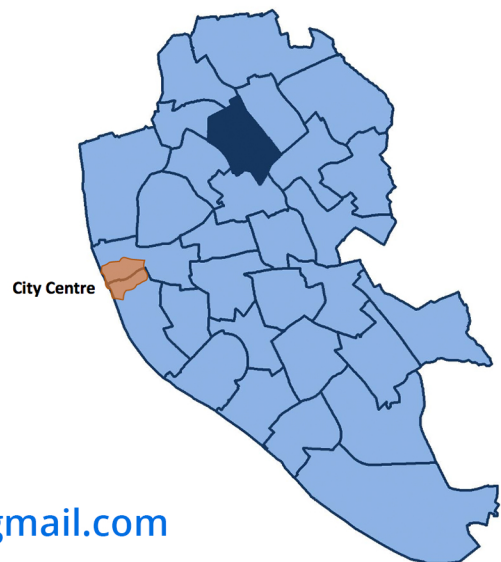
MEETINGS

JARGON BUSTER



As you can probably tell already, there are lots of acronyms that we use in the Labour Party. Hopefully this will help you understand most of them that we use:

Acronym	Meaning	Description
CLP	Constituency Labour Party	Every parliamentary constituency has a Constituency Labour Party (CLP). This is the body of all local members who live in the constituency. Liverpool Walton CLP meets bi-monthly, with the exception of August and December. The CLP has the ability to send delegates to the Labour Party's national conference, nominate members for internal party elections such as elections for the NEC and NPF, put forward motions and rule changes to conference, as well as selecting the parliamentary candidate.
BLP	Branch Labour Party	Each of our 6 wards within a CLP has its own Branch Labour Party (BLP). For example, Anfield BLP consists of members living in the Anfield ward. Each branch has its own elected officers who run the local branch. Branches also meet bi-monthly, in advance of the CLP meeting. The branch has the ability to hold local representatives to account, pass motions to the CLP, and select candidates for Local Government elections (Councillors).
PLP	Parliamentary Labour Party	The Parliamentary Labour Party (PLP) consists of the Labour Party's elected Members of Parliament (MPs). As well as its role voting on legislation and forming governments, the PLP has the ability to nominate individual MPs for the Party leadership. Each candidate for leader requires signatures from 15% of the PLP.
LCF	Local Campaign Forum	The Local Campaign Forum (LCF) is the campaigning body for a given area. We have an LCF that covers the whole area of Liverpool and we are allowed to send 7 delegates to the LCF. Responsibilities include setting the direction of campaigning across the city, as well as ratifying the panel of candidates for Local Government elections.
AGM	Annual General Meeting	Our Annual General Meeting (AGM) takes place once a year. Both the CLP and each of the six BLP's have an AGM to elect their officers and agree standing orders for the year ahead. The CLP AGM is usually in November.
NEC	National Executive Committee	The National Executive Committee (NEC) is the governing body of the Labour Party, overseeing the overall direction of the party and the policy-making process. It sets strategic objectives on an annual basis and meets regularly to review the work of the party.
NPF	National Policy Forum	The National Policy Forum (NPF) is where the Labour Party's policies are discussed and decided upon. The NPF is elected by members and comprises of the entire NEC as well as additional representatives from the regions and affiliated organisations.
